

2011 Baseball Rules and Procedures  
High School Season

1. All playing rules will follow the 2011 High School Federation rules unless modified by the local association as set out below, in addition all ASAA and ASD rules are to be followed.
2. Per High School rules, no pitcher may pitch more than 10 innings in a 3 day period, in Varsity and JV games in total.
3. By CIC rules no Varsity or JV player may play in more than 21 innings in a period from Monday thru Saturday (extra innings in games do not count toward this total). This rule may be waived by the District Director for Varsity make ups, if required. Varsity players competing in a JV game may wear the Varsity uniform, JV players playing up may wear a Varsity or JV uniform. Violation of the 21 inning rule will result in game forfeitures at the Varsity and JV levels.
4. No player may make an appearance in more than 2 games per day, (Varsity and JV combined). This means that if a player makes an appearance in a Varsity game on Saturday they may play in only one JV game on that Saturday.
5. Re-entry and DH are allowed per High School Federation rules.
6. VARSITY/JV SPEED UP RULE – the courtesy runner rule as used in the High School Federation rules will be in effect.
7. All games are to be umpired by the umpires group headed by Lucito Munoz or his designee; any questions should be directed to him. In some cases, only one umpire may be present. In that case the game will be played. There is no protest allowed under this scenario.
8. Field preparation for games will be done by a party under contact with the Alliance. In case of a doubleheader, field preparation will only be done for the first game, for the second game the teams playing will be responsible for sharing field preparation for that game.
9. Home team will occupy the First base dugout unless local field rules apply. Home team is responsible to supply three Diamond game balls at the start of the game. Additional balls in good condition are the responsibility of the home team in the event of requests from the umpires. The Home team will be responsible to provide baseballs at Mulcahy Stadium regardless of how many baseballs are lost during the game.  
The Home team is responsible for supplying the scorebook, which will be the official scorebook, unless an official scorebook is present and agreed to by both teams. Coaches are expected to furnish to the scorekeeper, 30 minutes before the game, a lineup card with numbers, first and last name, and position being played.

To conserve time, teams will not switch dugouts between games in a doubleheader.

10. Home team will take infield/outfield for 20 minutes, starting 45 minutes before the start of each game; the Visiting team will immediately follow for its 20 minute infield/outfield. There will be no infield/outfield between games of a doubleheader. Also, with multiple games being played on the same field, infield/outfield times may be shortened to ensure timely start times.
11. Reporting: In Varsity games the winning team is responsible to call scores to KTUU (Channel 2) at 762-9222; KIMO (Channel 13) at 762-8802 and the Anchorage Daily News at 257-4335 or fax line at 257-4342. The Daily News will ask for complete inning by inning details with highlights, battery for each team and totals of runs, hits and errors. This is important for the program so assign someone on your team to do this.
12. Each team is responsible for shagging balls near their dugouts, this includes outside of Mulcahy Stadium, and if a team does not retrieve balls then it must replace them in the game.
13. Each team is responsible for picking up the trash in the dugout area and the bleachers next to its dugout. This is **required** under the MOA Parks and Recreation permit.

There are no seeds or gum allowed at Mulcahy Stadium. Coaches and players who do not follow this rule will be disciplined. At Mulcahy Stadium games, admittance will be charged for all HS games since ALB pays the MOA for games at the Stadium. All HS coaches and coaches' wives will have free admittance. Any HS baseball player in uniform will have free admittance. A list of HS coaches will be available at the entry gate. The entry gate for Mulcahy is at the left field gate where entry fee can be taken. The right field gate is to remain locked during HS games.

An Announcer will be present for all HS games. Before the start of each game, teams will be introduced, and an anthem/pledge will be performed before the start of each game.

When playing multiple games at Mulcahy Stadium, teams are expected to exit their dugout within 5 minutes of the conclusion of their game so that the next incoming team can get situated. Post game team meeting need to take place off of the field.

The designated home team is responsible for determining whether the field is playable for that game. If the field is not playable, contact the head umpire to advise them before the game. Once the game has begun, umpires are in charge of field playability. Very few HS games in the CIC are postponed; but in that event, contact Jeff Blake (HS Director) who will coordinate a makeup date. Priority in makeup games will be given to Varsity teams.

14. Coaches are to be in uniform unless circumstances prevent it. Coaches not in uniform cannot leave the dugout for any action, before and during the game. Coats and wind pants are okay as long as the uniform is worn underneath. Coaches on defense must be inside the defined dugout area per high school federation rules. Umpires at game time will define the dead ball areas. Only players, coaches and team scorers are allowed in the dugout area.
15. Ejections – if a player, coach or spectator is ejected from a game the ejection is for the remainder of that game and one game immediately following that game. This applies to all personnel – players, coaches, managers and spectators per ASSA/ASD rules. The player is to remain at the field and out of sight of the game. This rule also applies to ejections in games outside of the district, it is the responsibility of the team manager to police this and observe the rule. After a second ejection for any player, coach, manager or spectator they cannot participate in a game until they have met with their school's activity principle for appropriate discipline.
